

TREASURER'S REPORT

Financial Information for the month ended August 31, 2023:

West Area:

The total receipts for the month ended August 31, 2023, were \$8,450 with total expenses of ended the month with an operational cash balance of \$95,103. We have a restricted cash balance of \$11,579 which consists mainly of in youth activities restricted monies.

Camp Kum-Ba-Ya:

The total operational receipts for the month ended August 31, 2023, were \$15,019 with total expenses of \$9,434, giving us a positive cash flow of \$5,585. We ended the month with an operational cash balance of \$61,232. This balance will give us a positive start to next camp season. We also had a restricted cash balance of \$99,334 which will be used mainly on camp upgrades. The large amount was due to a very successful fundraising drive.
