

ILSLEY CHRISTIAN CELEBRATES THREE MEMBERS



Three long-standing members of Ilsley Christian Church were given special recognition this fall for their many years of membership and ministry.

Kendall Lanham has attended Ilsley Christian since birth and was baptized in 1987. Over the years he has served in several roles--including deacon, elder, trustee, and held various positions on the Board. He currently serves as the Devotional Director.

Zenobia Lanham is a charter member of Ilsley Christian Church. In 1940, Zenobia began attending Bible School and Sunday School. She helped with Bible Schoool in the 1950s and became an official member and was baptized on July 16, 1967, just two years before Ilsley Presbyterian Church was re-organized as the Ilsley Christian Church. Zenobia held office and has been a member of the Christian Women's Fellowship throughout the years as well as served in several capacities, including being the first clerk of Ilsley Christian Church, deaconess, secretary of the Board, Sunday School teacher, and on the pulpit committee.

Addie Belle Bratcher is also a charter member of Ilsley Christian Church. In 1940, Addie Belle began attending Bible School and Sunday School. She began teaching Bible School in the 1950s and became on official member and was baptized on July 16, 1967--the same day as Zenobia! Addie Belle held office in the Christian Women's Fellowship, as well as served as deaconess, secretary and clerk of the Board, on the pulpit committee, and as a youth leader, and Sunday School and Bible School teacher and director.

What a gift these three have been, and continue to be, to the people and ministry of Ilsley Christian!
